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## Earthquake Disaster Section

# When an earthquake hits, protect yourself first

In Tonami City, if a large earthquake originates from the Ouchigata Fault Zone, you may experience tremors with a maximum seismic intensity of 7. (If you feel a tremor, try to act calmly without panicking)

## If you are at home...

Protect yourself by hiding underneath sturdy furniture like a desk or table. The tremors will last up to about 1 minute. It's dangerous to run outside during earthquakes, wait until tremors stops.





Don't forget to deal with any flames. Fire can cause secondary disasters. If the tremor is small, turn off any flames and the gas switch immediately, if the tremor is large, do so after the tremor has subsided. It is also important to unplug plugs from outlets and turn off the circuit breaker to prevent fire that may occur when they are energized.

Open doors and secure the exit. The building may become damaged due to the tremors, and doors or windows may not open.

Open doors before the aftershocks come.



## If you are outside...

#### On the road



There is a risk of collapse if you stand beside block walls, gate posts, etc. There is also a risk of signs and glass falling from building. Evacuate to a place where there are no objects that might fall or topple. It is also useful to protect your head with a bag or the like.

In addition, hanging wires are dangerous, so never approach or touch them.

### OAt a shopping center or supermarket

Protect your head with a bag or baskets, etc., and watch out for falling products and display cases.

Note that, if you try to evacuate in a hurry, you may get caught up in a stampede. Please follow the instructions of the staff to evacuate.





### Olf you are in an elevator

Press the buttons for all floors and get out on the floor where the elevator stops. If you become trapped, use the emergency button or intercom to communicate with the outside.

## If you are driving...



Sudden turning of the steering wheel and sudden braking cause accidents. Slowly pull over on the left side of the road. When you leave the car, do not lock it because it may be needed for emergency transportation.


(However, please take out important items such as your vehicle inspection certificate.)

## OBehavior patterns during evacuation

When a major earthquake strikes, it is difficult to act calmly. You should check your behavior patterns in order to act calmly without panicking in an emergency.

## Earthquake occurrence

- 1 When a hazard is confirmed (fire, house collapse, etc.)
- 2 When there is an evacuation instruction from the city hall, the police, the fire department, or the voluntary disaster prevention committee of your district




Check the estimated maximum seismic intensity at your home and other places.





# **Four Evacuation Behaviors**



Going outside during torrential rains is dangerous, even in a car. If you have no choice but to spend the night in your car, take great care to check your surroundings, etc., to make sure you are not caught in a flood.

## Wind/Water Damage Section

# Information gathering is vital for typhoons and heavy rains

Typhoons and heavy rain can be predicted to some extent before the occurrence of disasters based on weather information.

Gather information from the TV, radio, the Internet, and if you feel any abnormality or danger, tell your neighbors and evacuate!

Also, check the hazard map habitually to learn about the hazards around your home.

## If you are at home...

Window glass may break due to wind or flying objects. Stick duct tape on windows or lower curtains or blinds. In addition, move furniture and valuables to the second floor when there is a risk of flooding under or above the floor.

Make sure your smartphone and computer are fully charged beforehand so you can gather information.





## If you are outside...

Evacuate to indoors immediately (but do not run underground).

Also, stay away from rivers and cliffs.

## If you are driving...

Choose a place with little water and evacuate. If the engine stalls due to flooding, do not force the engine to restart in order to prevent a vehicle fire.



## When evacuating

#### Wear safe clothes that are comfortable for walking when evacuating.

Wear safe clothes that are comfortable for walking when evacuating. Protect your head with a helmet, etc., and wear sneakers that are more comfortable than boots (boots will be difficult to walk in when water enters).

Minimize luggage and keep your hands free, such as by using a backpack.



#### Walk with a long stick to use as a cane.

There may be a roadside gutter or a manhole with the lid off under the surface of the water. Check as you walk.

#### Be sure to travel in a group.

If you travel alone, you will not be able to call for help if you need it. To avoid getting separated, secure each person in the group with a rope and walk together.

In addition, cooperate with evacuation of the elderly, children, people with physical disabilities, and persons requiring consideration, in this case, please use a swimming ring.

#### Pay attention to the depth.

If the water depth of the flooded road is 50 cm or more, do not attempt to go to the evacuation center.

If the water flow is fast, it is difficult to walk even at a depth of 20 cm.

If there is a danger of falling into the water, be careful even at a depth of 10 cm.

\*\*1 Persons requiring consideration: Elderly people, people with disabilities, infants, pregnant women, and others who require special consideration.

## O Behavior patterns during evacuation

## Occurrence of typhoons and heavy rains

Voluntary evacuation

When evacuation information (evacuation of the elderly, etc., evacuation order) is issued



Check the surrounding situation



#### Outdoors is safe

Evacuate to a designated evacuation center (such as a school or district gymnasium), other evacuation center (such as a community center), safe relatives/acquaintances' homes, or a hotel or inn, etc.



Evacuate to the second floor or above of your home, or the second floor or more of a nearby building if you are outdoors

\*Wait for rescue in a safe place.

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### OWhen there is a risk of a landslide disaster

Predicting landslide disasters is difficult, but there may be early warning signs. If you observe any of the following phenomena, please evacuate as soon as possible.

In addition, in Toyama Prefecture, if a landslide disaster occurs, an area that is likely to cause harm to the lives or bodies of residents, etc. is designated as a "Landslide Disaster Warning Area," and an area that is likely to cause damage to buildings and cause significant harm to the lives or bodies of residents, etc. is designated as a "Landslide Special Disaster Warning Area."

## Types of landslide disasters and precursor phenomena

# Cliff collapse

- Cracks appear on cliffs
- Pebbles fall from cliffs
- The amount of spring water increases
- Trees shake



- Abnormal mountain sounds/ground sounds
- The sound of trees rustling and cracking
- A smell of leaf mold from rivers
- Driftwood appears in rivers



- Cracks and steps appear on slopes
- Water gushes out from slopes
- The sound of trees rustling and cracking
- Water in ponds and wells becomes muddy







### What is landslide disaster warning information?

Disaster prevention information jointly announced by the Japan Meteorological Agency and prefectures when the risk of landslide disasters due to heavy rain increases. It is important to evacuate as soon as the landslide disaster warning information is issued.

In the Toyama Prefecture Landslide Disaster Warning Information Support System, you can check the risk of landslide disasters, and if you register for the email delivery service, you will be sent disaster information.



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## **Snow Damage Section**

# Measures against heavy snowfall that can be taken at home



### Concerns about heavy snowfall

- · It will be difficult to use your car and you will not be able to go to buy food and fuel.
- It takes longer than usual times to deliver items to convenience stores and other stores, and bread and instant food may be out of stock.
- You will not be able to visit the hospital for health-related reasons such as artificial dialysis and medication.
- · Houses, etc. (carports and vinyl houses) may be damaged or collapse.

### What to prepare in advance

- Stockpile water, food, fuel (kerosene), etc. in case of circulation disruptions caused by heavy snow.
- Try to order medications a little earlier (more) so as not to run out of prescription medications for chronic diseases.
- Keep disposable body warmers, spare batteries, a flashlight, a portable radio, etc. in case of long-term power outages. Portable gas stoves and hot water bottles are also useful for keeping you warm.
- · Work on snowproofing your house (carport, vinyl house).

#### Pay attention to slips and falls!

- · Concerns about heavy snowfall
- It will be difficult to use your car and you will not be able to go to buy food and fuel.
- It takes time to deliver items to convenience stores and other stores, and bread and instant food may be out of stock.
- You will not be able to visit the hospital for health-related reasons such as artificial dialysis and medication.
- · Houses, etc. (carports and vinyl houses) may be damaged or collapse.

## Use extreme caution when driving!!

Even if you are using winter tires, you may get stuck or have an accident due to slipping. In addition, even if you are driving carefully, the surrounding cars are likely to slip and you may become involved in an accident, so refrain from going out when it is not necessary or urgent as much as possible.

Bring chains, extra fuel, a scoop, boots, gloves, food, and drinking water for your car in case your car gets stuck.

## Safety first when removing snow!!!

Snow removal work, such as removing snow from roofs and snow shoveling around the home, is accompanied by the risk of accidents, with many casualties occurring throughout Japan every year. Use extreme caution when clearing snow.

- 1. Two or more people should do the work call your family and neighbors!
- 2. Remove snow while leaving snow around the building!
- 3. Be careful on sunny days. The snow on the roof is loose!
- 4. Don't forget to secure your ladder!
- 5. Turn off the engine before removing snow jams from your snowblower!
- 6. Be careful even with a low roof!
- 7. Be especially cautious right after you start working and when you're tired!
- 8. Wear a lifeline and helmet even if it is troublesome!
- 9. Maintain and inspect lifelines, snowblowers, and other equipment on a regular basis!
- 10. Take your phone with you when you work!





## Fire Section

## **Initial firefighting if a fire occurs!**

If you are present at a fire scene, it is important to report, carry out initial firefighting, and evacuate.

## OBehavioral patterns during evacuation

Let others know as soon as possible

## Fire occurrence

Tell the neighbors loudly, "It's a fire!"



Calmly state accurate information.

- 1. "It's a fire"... State that a fire has occurred
- 2. "Fire location"... Ensure that you state the address and what is on fire
- 3. "What is on fire"... State what is burning where.
- 4. "Your name"

Initial firefighting fire extinguisher, water bucket, etc.







①Pull out the safety pin

②Remove the hose and point it at the fire source

③Spray the water by strongly grasping the lever

Evacuate to the outdoors

Wait for the fire brigade
in a safe place

- \*\*The limit of flames that can be extinguished with a fire extinguisher is generally the height of the ceiling.
- \*\*Hold your mouth and nose with a wet towel or handkerchief and evacuate in a low position.

## Initial firefighting method

#### **☆Stove**

- It is strictly prohibited to pour water on an oil pan in haste.
- Use a fire extinguisher and spray to cover the entire pan.
- If there is no fire extinguisher, cover the front with a wet bath towel or the like to block the air.

#### **☆Electrical appliances**

 There is a risk of electric shock if you suddenly pour water on it. Unplug the appliance or switch off the circuit breaker and use a powder fire extinguisher to extinguish the fire.

#### **☆Clothing**

- · If your clothes catch fire, remove them immediately and put the fire out with your feet. If you cannot remove your clothes, roll on the ground or floor to extinguish the fire.
- · If there is any hot water in the bath, jump into the bathtub.

## ☆Curtains, sliding doors, sliding screens

 Curtains, sliding doors, and sliding screens become pathways when a fire is burning. It is important to extinguish the fire before it spreads. Pull down the curtains knock down sliding doors and sliding screens before firefighting.

#### ☆Heater

- In principle, extinguish with a fire extinguisher.
- If there is no fire extinguisher, cover the front with a wet blanket or the like to block the air.

#### **☆Bonfires**

- Extinguish with a fire extinguisher, water, or soil.
- To prevent bonfires from spreading, pour water not only on the center of the bonfire, but also around the surroundings.



## First aid you need to know



## Let's learn first aid

In the event of a large-scale disaster, an ambulance may not be able to arrive immediately as usual. Without panicking, carefully investigate and treat the person's situation.



## Cardiopulmonary resuscitation

If there is a person who has fallen down

#### No reaction

- · Check the surrounding safety.
- Speak to them while gently patting them
   an the above

Seek help with a loud voice and ask others for specific help



Confirm

\*When there is only one rescuer, first call 119 yourself.

If you know that there is an AED in the immediate vicinity, go to get it.

Check whether there is breathing

#### None

- · Check the person is breathing as usual.
- · Judge the rise and fall of the chest and stomach within 10 seconds.

Chest compression (cardiac massage)

Continuous compressions at a fast speed of 100-120 times per minute PREMISE PREMISE

 Place both hands on the lower half of the sternum in the middle of the left and right sides, and press firmly 30 times until the chest sinks about 5 cm.



★In the case of a child/infant

Depth of compression: Compress until about one-third of the chest thickness sinks

Method of compression: For children, compress with both hands or one hand depending on their physique, for infants, compress with two fingers



Artificial respiration (securing the airway)

Put one hand on their forehead and the fingertips of your other hand on their chin, then tilt their head back and raise their chin.

 With the airway secured, pinch their nose with your forehead hand, open their mouth wide, cover the injured persons' mouth, and breathe in for about 1 second.

\*It is useful to have infection protection equipment.

★If the injured person is bleeding from their face or mouth, or if you are hesitant, continue with chest compressions only.



## When to stop the cardiopulmonary resuscitation method

- · Until it is observed that the injured person can breathe normally and move with purpose.
- Until the emergency services take over.



## First aid



## Hemorrhage -

#### (1) Compress the wound (2) Do not touch

Apply gauze or a clean handkerchief, etc. directly to the wound and firmly hold it.



## the blood directly

To prevent infection, use a plastic bag, garbage bag, etc. to avoid direct contact with blood



#### 3 Make the wound higher than the heart

If the wound is a finger or arm, bringing the wound higher than the heart will reduce the amount of bleeding.





## Burns 🛟



#### **1**Cool with water immediately

Leave tap water running in the washbasin and put the burned limb under the water.



After cooling, lightly wrap the burned area with a clean cloth or gauze and go to a medical facility immediately.



#### **3Do not crush** any blisters.

Crushing a blister can make it more susceptible to infection. Go to a medical facility as soon as possible.



#### \*How to cool when wearing clothes

After cooling the area with the clothes on, carefully remove the clothes while applying water.

When it is difficult to remove the clothes, cut with scissors.

However, if the skin is adhering to the clothes, do not forcibly remove them.




## Bone fracture



#### **1) Treat the wound and bleeding without** moving the injured person.

#### \*How to identify fractures

- · The injured area is unnaturally deformed.
- · Swelling and severe pain.
- The bone is protruding.
- · Even if it is not clear from the appearance, if it is suspicious, consider it to be a fracture and treat it accordingly.



#### <sup>2</sup>Fix the affected area

Attach a splint and fix the joints above and below the fractured part so that the fracture part does not shift. If you don't have a splint, use a nearby substitute (such as an umbrella).



## **Voluntary Disaster Prevention Section**

## Protecting ourselves

The transportation network may be disrupted in the event of a major disaster, and public services such as firefighters and the police may not be able to respond adequately.

The voluntary disaster prevention ability of the community demonstrates its strength at such times.

## Create a circle with your neighbors

#### ☐Start by reaching out to your neighbors

Getting to know your neighbors and having them remember you isn't just about helping others, it's also about having them help you in an emergency. Greet your neighbors proactively.

### ☐Participate actively in local events

Many small acts of cooperation will result in great unity. As this unity spreads, we will create a more cooperative society.

## Let's create a communication network at the municipal association/town association level

Let's prepare a roster for each municipal association to confirm safety in case of an emergency.

# Gain an understanding of the elderly and people with disabilities in your area

#### ☐ Find out if anyone in your neighborhood needs help

There are people in the neighborhood who cannot evacuate without help. Let's discuss how to evacuate such people in the neighborhood.

# □ Let's understand the registration system for those who need support to evacuate.

In addition, let's proceed with the creation of an "individual evacuation plan" that describes who will support those who need help to evacuate, where to evacuate, and what kind of consideration is needed in case of emergency.

## □Discover disaster risks through disaster prevention town walks

You can walk around your own area and see and recognize the disaster risks near you. It is also an opportunity for adults to teach children about past disasters and lessons learned, and for elementary and junior high school students to cooperate to build exchanges and trust between generations.

# Join a regional voluntary disaster prevention organization

In Tonami City, there are voluntary disaster prevention organizations in all 21 districts, and disaster prevention specialists are also deployed.

Please actively participate in disaster drills and disaster prevention training sessions organized by voluntary disaster prevention organizations and disaster prevention experts in each district. It will definitely help you in an emergency.

Person in charge of the fire extinguisher, person in charge of electricity (turn off circuit breakers), person in charge of the gas switch, person in charge of emergency products

## Let's secure food, drinking water, etc.



Immediately after a disaster, assistance supplies may not be sufficiently distributed.

Stock up on at least 3 days' worth of emergency food, drinking water, etc. at home.

#### Examples of stockpile items

a. Food Aid Rice, precooked rice, retort foods, canned foods, cup noodles, etc.

b. Drinking water Have at least 3 liters per adult per day of water.

It is also advisable to prepare a plastic container for receiving

water rationing.

**c. Fuel** Table stove, solid fuel, spare gas cartridges, etc.

**d. Tools** Bar, saw, hammer, rope, scoop, etc. that can be used for

rescue operations.

**e. Other** Simple toilet, blankets, sleeping bags, cold protectors, paper

dishes, paper cups, masks, disposable stove, wet wipes, toilet paper, battery operated radio, portable charger, life jackets, etc.

## KEYPONT Stockpiling Key Points!!



 Stockpile at least 3 days' worth of food and drinking water, preferably a week's worth.

Have 3 liters of water per adult per day and 2,000 calories of food.

Pay attention to the expiration date for food, and the batteries for electrical appliances such as radios.

Prepare extra batteries, gas cartridges, etc.

 $\bigcirc$  Your stockpile will vary depending on your family composition.

Think about and prepare what your family really needs. For example...

infants: powdered milk, baby food, baby bottles, diapers, etc. Elderly: nursing supplies, medications for chronic diseases, etc. Pets: Pet food, lead, cage, etc.





You should make your pet practice entering the cage habitually. It is always useful when evacuating or at an evacuation center! It is important to make your pet feel that the cage is a safe place.

A facility that serves as a base for activities in the district and a base for communication with the city and material support.

Some facilities cannot be used depending on the type of disaster, so please refer to the Tonami City website and each hazard map for details.







## Lighting fixtures

Secure hanging lighting fixtures in several places with chains and fittings. For fluorescent lamps, fasten both ends of the fluorescent tube with heat-resistant tape.



Double door-type cupboards should be fitted with stoppers to prevent the doors from opening. Apply anti-scattering film to the glass surface to make it safe.

Fasten the end of the belt to the base material of the wall through the belt mounting port or handle to prevent it from falling over.

Refrigerator

Dressers/Bookshelves

Dressers/bookshelves should be firmly fixed with metal fittings. For furniture that is divided up and down, keep the joint connected with metal fittings.

# Safety measures around the house



- OCheck the block walls for cracks or damage.
- Olt is very dangerous if a block wall collapses.
- ODo not put anything that might scatter on the veranda.
- OWhen placing flowerpots, etc., keep them in a safe position so that they do not fall.
- OThe rain gutter should be cleaned regularly to ensure smooth drainage.
- OPropane gas cylinders should be firmly fixed with a chain.

## Learn the magnitude of earthquake tremors

■Estimated maximum seismic intensity in Tonami City: 6-lower to 7



[Magnitude 4]

- Almost everyone feels surprised. Hanging items
- such as lamps shake strongly. Ounstable items
- may fall over.



[Magnitude 6-lower] It is difficult to stand

- Most unfixed furniture moves and some collapses. Doors may not open
- Wall tiles and windows may be damaged or fall
- Wooden buildings with low earthquake resistance may have tiles falling or buildings may tilt. Some buildings may collanse



[Magnitude 5-lower] •Most people feel fearful and want to hold onto

- things Tableware and books on the shelves may fall.
- Furniture that is not fixed may move, and unstable items may fall.





[Magnitude 6-upper]

You cannot move unless you crawl. You may be thrown by the


earthquake.

- Most unfixed furniture will move, and many will fall
- Many wooden buildings with low earthquake resistance tilt or collapse.
- There may be large cracks in the ground, large-scale landslides. and collapse of mountain



[Magnitude 5-upper] It is difficult to walk without

- grasping things. Many tableware and books on shelves will fall.
- Furniture that is not fixed may fall. Unreinforced
- block walls may collapse.



[Magnitude 7]

- Even more wooden buildings with low earthquake resistance will tilt and collapse.
- Even some wooden buildings with high earthquake resistance may tilt.
- Many rebar-concrete buildings with low earthquake resistance collapse.



# Check how to contact your family when you are separated

If you are separated, it is important to check the safety of your family. Check with your family how you will do it, and prepare for an emergency.

## Use the message dial "171"

NTT will start the "Disaster Message Dial" service when safety confirmation calls in a disaster area become congested.



### When recording a message

Telephone number for home, mobile phone, etc.

→ Deliver the message (within 30 seconds)

Telephone number for home, mobile phone, etc.

→ Listen to message


## Use a pay phone

## Let's make a My Timeline Sheet for our family

My Timeline is a family evacuation plan that organizes "when," "who," and "what" in advance in order to prepare for wind and water disasters such as typhoons and heavy rain. By creating it in advance and organizing your evacuation behavior, you can act without panicking in case of an emergency.

#### **1**City website

The website has everything you need to know about the city. You can get the information you need by searching for words and phrases that are updated daily. However, you need to search and confirm it yourself each time.

#### 2 Emergency emails from the city

If you register your email address, you will automatically receive emergency information such as evacuation and countermeasures. In addition, it is transmitted for each genre of "disaster prevention," "roads," bears," and "other'.



When you sign up (add as a friend), you'll automatically receive city tips about once a week. Disaster prevention and emergency information is transmitted promptly without limitation on the number of messages.



#### 4 City official X

When you sign up (follow), you'll receive updates from the city, as well as local events and other topics automatically. Disaster prevention/emergency information is also transmitted promptly.

#### 5 Yahoo! **Disaster Prevention Bulletin App**

If you register (install) the app on your smartphone, you will receive disaster information such as earthquake information and heavy rain forecasts automatically.



## **©Tonami Tulip Safety Emails** (Prefectural Police)

If you select Tonami Police Station and register your email address, you will receive information about suspects in the city, information about special scams, and local safety information such as bear sighting field information.
